You only need to return envelopes if it is a CASH PAYMENT.

Payment may be made online but you must use the **School Code 365918** that is on the top of the online payment sheet.

Family Photos:

Online family photo orders close at **12 noon the day before photos are to be taken, i.e. tomorrow Wednesday 4th April.**

Family photo **envelopes** are for **cash orders only**. Orders that are made on the day are **CASH** and **MUST** be handed straight to the photographer on the day.

School Captains and House Captains photos will be able to be viewed online, but you will only be able to do an online purchase. If you want to pay cash you will need to pre-order without viewing the photos. Please collect an envelope from the office for **CASH PAYMENTS ONLY**.

PLEASE NOTE:

The photographers will be taking family photos from 8.30am in the morning. Children need to take their envelopes over to the hall with them and give to the photographers.

The whole school photograph will be taken at 9.00am. Please make sure all students are here before the bell.

It is requested that all students wear their **full school summer uniform**.
