### **The District Athletics Carnival Report 2019**

Last Friday 46 students competed against the best athletes from the other 6 schools in our district at the South Shoalhaven Athletics Carnival. It was a very successful carnival for our school. We won the Points Percentage Shield meaning that on average our athletes performed better than any other school. The overall carnival trophy was won by St George's Basin Public School.

There were numerous notable achievements by Sussex Inlet Public School Athletes. In the running events, Summer Firmstone and Liliana Klimiuk came first and second in the Jnr 800m Run with Hayden winning the Jnr Boys 800m Run. Jayme also came second in the 100m Dash and Aiden Bown placed third in the 11yrs 100m Dash. Bella Lord came 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 12yrs 100m Dash and Jada McDonagh came 4<sup>th</sup> in the 8yrs 100m Dash. In the 200m Dash, Payton McDonagh, Maddison Austin and Tyson Clarke all placed 4<sup>th</sup> with Bella and Jayme finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> in their events.

Our students were very successful in the 1500m Events with Melodie Buchanan taking 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 11 Yrs Girls Event, Liliana Klimiuk taking 1<sup>st</sup> in the Jnr Girls and Hayden Webber taking 1<sup>st</sup> in the Jnr Boys. Violet Keywood also ran a strong race to take 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the Snr Girls 1500m Event. Our relay teams struggled against some strong teams with the exception of the Snr Girls Team which finished 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Our students also performed well in the field events. Our girls were strong in the High Jump Events with Isabelle Farrugia winning the 11yrs Girls event. Jayme and Liliana came 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> respectively in the Jnr Girls Event. Bella Lord finished 4<sup>th</sup> in the Snr Girls Event. In the Shot Put we had both Riley Douglas and Bella Lord placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in their events. Savannah McCracken won the Jnr Girls Shot Put with a massive throw of 6.98m. Bella won the Snr Girls Long Jump with a huge jump of 4.03m.

Maddison Austin came 4<sup>th</sup> in the Snr Girls Discus Event. Bella Lord and Liliana Klimiuk were both runners up for the Age Champion for the Senior Girls and Junior Girls respectively. An amazing effort!

It was a very successful day and all of our athletes can be proud of the way that they represented our school. A big thank you to Karen Jones and Leanne Webber for managing the team and to Emily Austin for taking some great photos.

The top 3 finalists in the 100m Dash events and the top 2 finalists in all other events go through to the South Coast Regional Athletics Carnival at the Australian Institute of Sport in Canberra. The exception is the 800m and 1500m Events. Both 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place getters will need to wait to see if their times qualify to make it to the Regional Carnival. This is different to last year where 1<sup>st</sup> place automatically qualified. If you have any questions feel free to contact me.
